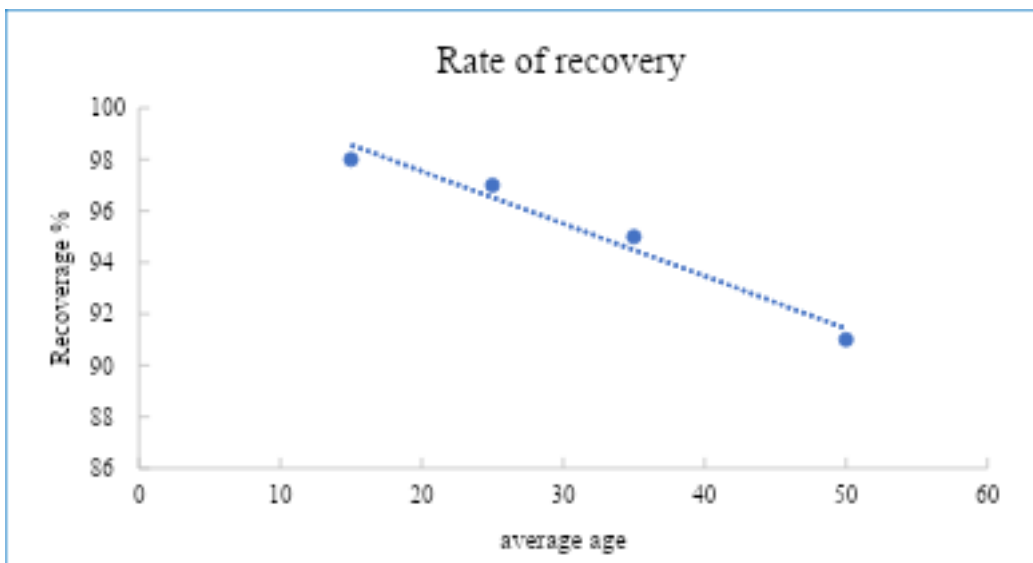


Figure 1. Correlation between the average age of treated patients and percentage of recovery after 5 days of treatment.
